

he International Institute for the Sociology of Law (IISJ) was founded in 1988 by the International Sociological Association's Research Committee on the Sociology of Law, and the Basque Government. The IISJ has now become the home of the international sociology of law community.

The Institute is located in the old University of Oñati building, dating from 1543, a magnificent example of Spanish Renaissance architecture. The building has been renovated to accommodate a documentation centre, library, administrative offices and meeting rooms.

The Master's degree in Sociology of Law of the IISL is taught in English. The Master's degree (60 ECTS) is awarded as an official Master of Arts degree of the University of the Basque Country.

The programme has two major components: intensive seminars from September 2017 to March 2018 (40 ECTS credits), and an individual research project (Master's thesis) (20 ECTS credits) defended in September 2018. From April to September, students have the option of remaining in Oñati, visiting another university or going back to their home university.

The course prepares students for independent scientific research and enlarges their capacity for practical problem solving. The programme aims to increase the students' knowledge and understanding of issues of law in society, as well as their cultural, political and economic contexts, from a comparative and international perspective. The course also prepares students for independent research .

The courses provide an unparalleled opportunity for close personal contacts with eminent scholars in socio-legal studies, who introduce students to the leading work, and can provide direct contacts to the main researchers and networks in their field. The Scientific Director also helps in the development of the finnal dissertation, while providing continuity and individual advice and supervision.

Students may apply to participate in one or more of the specific courses offered without taking the whole degree

APPLICATION PROCEDURES



andidates must have a University degree in sociology, law, social sciences and/or in another discipline related to Sociology of Law. Undergraduates in their final year may be admitted on the basis of their previous results, but they must already have been awarded their first degree diploma by the time the Master's course begins.

Applicants must display a very good working knowledge of English, reading and writing as well as spoken. The ability to use social science literature published in other languages

is useful.

Total tuition fees for the 2017/18 Master's Programme come to €3,000. Tuition fees for participation in single courses are €300.

The IISL can offer a limited number of grants to support students who would otherwise not be able to afford to attend the Master's Programme. Grants can cover part of or all the tuition fees and/or the cost of a shared room in the Institute's Residence. Grants include the Renato Treves Scholarships, the Neelan Tiruchelvam Fellowships and a scholarship for local candidates provided by the Oñati Town Hall.

ACOMMODATION



Students are generally lodged in the IISL Residencia Antia in Oñati. It is a historic building dating from the 18th Century, at a short walk from the Institute.

The Residence has 22 ensuite rooms, as well as a TV room, computer room, communal kitchen, dining and other rooms, and washing and drying facilities. Staying in the Residence is subject to payment, including a deposit, and compliance with the house rules. Residence charges cover the provision of sheets, blankets, pillows and towels, which are

changed and the bedroom cleaned once a week.

Students can opt to have a single or to share a room. The price per person in a single room is 417 euros per month and the price for person sharing a double room is 248 euros per month.
