MARIELLA CARRINO GRANT – in memoriam

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The International Institute for the Sociology of Law of Oñati (IISL) and the Carrino family have created the **‘Mariella Carrino Annual Programme for the promotion of socio-legal research’**.

Through this programme, in memory of Mariella Carrino and her post-published doctoral thesis work, her family wishes to promote scientific studies on **social conflict, housing policy and housing rights**, and thus facilitate the careers of young researchers interested in these subjects, by providing an annual financial contribution for this purpose.

The conditions for applying for the **‘Mariella Carrino grant – in memoriam’**, previously validated by the Scientific Committee, will be published annually on the website of the International Institute for the Sociology of Law (IISL) www.iisj.net, which undertakes to faithfully respect the spirit in which this scholarship was created.

1. Type of research project:

These are projects to promote research in socio-legal matters, preferably those related to social conflicts on public housing policies and the right to housing, in accordance with the thematic area studied by Mariella Carrino.

Alternatively, the grant may also be used to cover the tuition fees of a student of the International Master in Sociology of Law taught at the IISL, by reimbursement of the allocated amount.

2. Recipients and features:

2.1. The Programme will consist of a grant, donated by the Carrino family, which will be offered to research projects on the aforementioned subjects, preferably developed by students or graduates of the International Master's in Sociology of Law taught at IISL.

2.2. The recipient of the grant must carry out the research at the IISL and will benefit from access to the library and documentation centre as well as participation in all the Institute's activities, including research lines. It is important that the recipient undertakes academic activity at the Institute that may benefit IISL scientific community.

2.3. The application and the research project must be written in English or fully translated into English if originally written in another language. In this case, the original version must also be attached to the application or submitted with the final project.

2.4. The grant may be applied for as an individual or as a group. In the second case, a person must be appointed as the person responsible for the direction of the research. In order to be eligible for the grant, it is essential to have a university degree that supports the research. This requirement will be checked beforehand by the Scientific Committee.

3. The Scientific Committee:

The Scientific Committee will be composed of five members: two members proposed by the Carrino family and two by the IISL. Of the latter, one will be chosen from among the members of the IISL Board appointed by the Basque Government, and the other from among the members appointed by the Research Committee on Sociology of Law (RCSL). The four members will appoint the fifth member.



4. **Deadlines:**

The official call for applications will be published on the IISL website and through its media channels, including the terms and conditions of the grant and the deadlines for submitting applications using the form provided for this purpose by the IISL.

The Scientific Committee will be responsible for evaluating the applications and awarding the grant before 31 July.

Grant recipients must conduct their research between September and December of the year in which the grant is awarded. To do so, they must submit a detailed work plan that must be approved by the Scientific Committee, including their participation in the Institute's research activities, such as lines of research, seminars and dissemination events.

A research project must be submitted by 30 November. The Scientific Committee will evaluate its quality and approve the document or may indicate aspects to be improved or completed, which will be corrected before the final submission and validation of the research project.

Summary of deadlines:

- Submission of applications: as indicated in the publication.
- Award of the grant: before 31 July.
- Submission of the work plan: first week of September.
- Submission of the research project: before 30 November (2,500 words).
- Submission of the final research project validated by the Scientific Committee and declaration of authorship and originality of the research: by 31 December (15,000 words)

5. **Payments:**

The amount granted by the Carrino family is €4,000 (four thousand euros): **4000€** (Four thousand euros).

The grant will be paid in the following way:

- 1º) **20%** of the total amount within one month of the election of the beneficiary.
- 2º) **50%** once the advanced draft of the research project has been approved by the Scientific Committee.
- 3º) **30%** once the final project has been submitted and approved by the Scientific Committee.

The IISL reserves the right not to pay the corresponding amounts in case of non-compliance with any of the necessary requirements or validation by the Scientific Committee, duly informing the parties involved.

In the event of resignation or breach of the terms of the grant, the IISL must be reimbursed the partial amounts previously paid for the grant. The Carrino family or their representative will be duly informed and the destination of the reimbursed amounts will be agreed upon. The same will apply in case of vacancy.

6. **Intellectual property and advertising:**

The research work is protected by Intellectual Property Law. Consequently, the ownership of intellectual property rights will correspond to the person who has carried it out, unless otherwise established, under the terms and conditions provided for in the legislation in force.

The successful applicants will waive any financial compensation for royalties from the IISL.



Any publication, conference or publicity of the research work that is the subject of the grant must refer to the **‘Mariella Carrino Annual Programme for the Promotion of Socio-Legal Research’** and the **‘Mariella Carrino Grant – in memoriam’**.

For all purposes, as far as the research work that is the object of the grant is concerned, the researcher will appear with the institutional affiliation of the IISL, and this will be stated where appropriate.

The IISL will have preference in the publication of the research work, both on paper and in electronic format, complying with the publicity requirement contained in this section. The IISL may waive this right for the benefit of the author, if so decided by the Scientific Committee.

The IISL may consider offering discounts to facilitate accessibility and affordability of the eventual costs of accommodation at the Antia Residence during the period of in-person stay at the Institute, in order to encourage academic collaboration and participation in the IISL's own research activities.

7. Requirements and documents to be submitted:

7.1. APPLICATION FORM:

7.2. The following documentation must be attached to the form:

- 1. Document accrediting a university degree (official degree).
- 2. Curriculum Vitae.
- 3. Project title, summary (maximum 300 words) including the rationale and relevance of the research, and keywords.
- 4. A detailed outline of the research project (2-5 pages).
- 5. Preview of the bibliography to be used.
- 6. Work plan and schedule, including the time devoted to the Institute's research activities.
- 7. Any other document justifying the research capacity of the candidates.

7.3. The IISL will acknowledge receipt of the application in due course. Without this requirement, the application will not be considered submitted. If the application is incomplete, a request for correction will be made and a new deadline for compliance will be indicated. If the requirements are not met by this deadline, the application will be considered not submitted.

7.4. Use of Artificial Intelligence: The project covered by the grant must comply with the policy for the ethical, responsible and transparent use of artificial intelligence tools contained in the [‘Guide to the Use of Artificial Intelligence \(AI\)’](#) developed and published by the IISL.
